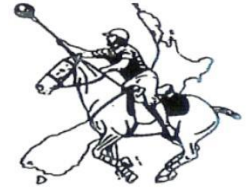


New Zealand Polocrosse Disciplinary Procedure



Disciplinary Procedure for all Polocrosse games in New Zealand.

- A verbal complaint to be address at the time and depending on severity to be followed by an incident report.
- All written complaints to be received by a member of the Umpires Panel, or the Umpires Panel Administrator, no later than 3 days after the incident.
- From the notification by the umpires panel to the offending person they have 24 hours in which to reply and dispute.
- In the incident of physical abuse a player may be stood down for the remainder of the weekend depending on the severity of the incident, as decided by the umpire's panel.
- It is suggested by the panel that those who dispute their charges and the disciplinary action that follows, if still found guilty the stand-down period be doubled.
- When talking about a week stand down, this constitutes a week in which your club participates in a carnival.
- Using abusive, insulting, threatening or obscene language towards or in relation to an umpire or official - 2 weekends.
- Using abusive, insulting, threatening or obscene language towards or in relation to another player - 1 weekend.
- Disputing a decision of an umpire - 1 weekend.
- Intentional striking another person (single strike)- 2 weekends.
- Intentional striking another person (multiple strikes) - 4 weekends.
- Horse abuse - 1 weekend.
- Failing to leave the playing field when directed to do so by the umpire - 2 weekends.
